## Field Trips

One of the best ways to learn about butterflies and where to find them is to go on a field trip with experienced leaders who will share their knowledge with you.

Each year the Rochester Butterfly Club organizes at least 15 guided field trips to prime butterfly spots in the local area, including some members' gardens. These trips take place on both weekdays and weekends.

The trips are listed in our annual schedule sent out to members in the spring.

We are always pleased to welcome non-members on our trips. You need only to show up at our butterfly walks as announced in the printed schedule. If you have them, bring a pair of binoculars and a butterfly identification book. (If you don't have a book of your own, try your local library.)

## Newsletter

Members receive our newsletter "Butterly News," which is published 3-4 times a year. It includes a variety of articles and topical information about our local butterflies.

## Special Interests

### Field Observations:

We enjoy watching and identifying butterflies by using binoculars.

### Listing:

We count butterflies seen on field trips and our personal sightings in order to build a database for Western New York.

### Photography:

We take photographs of butterflies for study and identification.

### Gardening:

We learn which plants are best in a butterfly garden and share our experiences with others.

### Conservation:

We leave all natural places as we found them and encourage preservation of butterfly habitat.

### Meetings:

We have 2-3 indoor talks each year.

### 4th of July Butterfly Counts:

We participate in this annual national census in cooperation with the North American Butterfly Association. Results help to establish the growth or decline of butterfly populations nationwide.
